Project Developments

The next key step for this project is to place the two major contracts for the supply and installation of the wind turbines and for the civil and electrical works. We hope to settle these contracts in the next month or so. Once they are placed we will make an announcement on our website.

We intend to begin construction of the wind farm in 2019 with electricity being generated in the first quarter of 2020.

We plan to start the upgrade works to Range Road in April and expect this will take approximately ten weeks to complete. We've finished the final road design plans and they are currently being reviewed by Upper Lachlan Shire Council. We require their approval before the road work can commence.

About the Project

Biala Wind Farm is located approximately 6km south of Grabben Gullen on Grabben Gullen Road. It is owned by BJCE Australia, who also own Gullen Range Wind Farm and Gullen Solar Farm. Biala Wind Farm is proposed to have 31 turbines and was awarded a Development Approval in April 2017 by the NSW Planning Assessment Commission. It will connect to the electricity grid via underground electricity cables from the Gullen Range Wind Farm substation at Bannister.
